We've all been lulled into a false sense of security with the weather this season... or at least we've wondered when (or if) winter would finally show up this year. Yeah! Right! Well, it's finally arrived in full vigor! Cold temps, big dumps of snow and strong winds. Phil REALLY did see his shadow this year!!! I'm not sure about the rest of you, but I predict that spring will finally arrive, as it does every year, on Mar. 20. LOL!

February's **Skeet and Eat Practice League** went well, with 18 of the 20 spots full. There was some good and some not-so-good shooting, but a good time was had by all attendees. The food didn't hurt either... sausage and kraut, chicken tortilla soup, salad, bread and rolls, brownies and soda... yum, yum! The 28 gauge practice is Mar. 10 and 410 bore will follow on Mar 31. There was also a bit of a celebration going on, as the **2019 Michigan State Skeet Team** had just been announced. **Five** DSC members were named to the Team: Bill Nielsen and Andrew Bielman made the Open Championship Team, Jerry Davis was Veteran Champ, Rick Trawinski made the 20 gauge Team, and Jerry Kott made the 28 gauge Team. Belt buckles will be awarded to the Team at the Michigan State Championship shoot in mid-August. Andrew Bielman was also recognized for shooting the most number of targets (10,100) in Michigan during 2018.

The **Skeet & Trap Fun (Flurries) Shoot** held Feb. 9 was a blast... literally! We ran three rotations, with the first two having targets thrown to a pair of shooters every 3-seconds. Things were changed a bit for the third rotation, with the timing being changed to a target every 2-seconds! If you thought that shooting two targets and

then reloading two shells (to be ready to shoot again) in 9-seconds was quick, try doing it in -6 seconds! WOW... what a blast!!! Make sure you watch for the next Flurries Event and come on out to join in the fun! We're looking at trying to get the **next Fun Shoot** set up for Apr., so watch for details!

Following the February kick off of the **Registered Skeet** season with the Snow Shoe Open (12 and 20 ga.), DSC will host their next shoot on Sunday, Mar. 17... the **Shillelaugh Open** (28 ga. and 410 bore). For those of you jones-ing for some more time with your side-by-side or pump shotgun, the second **Vintage Skeet Shoot** of the year will be held on Sat., Feb. 16. **Junior Shotgun Practice** will continue (Mar. 3, 17 and 31; Apr. 14 and 28), as our shooters are getting ready for the **SCTP SE Conference Championship** shoot at DSC on Sat., May 18. Please check with your coach or check with the Pro Shop for practice dates, as they may change.

Finally, the 'WINTER' hours at Skeet & Trap will revert back to 'SUMMER' hours on Wed., Mar. 27 to coincide with the start of the **Spring Skeet and Trap League** on **Thu., Mar. 28**. The ranges will resume summer hours and open Wednesday and Thursday from 10am until 8pm (rather than current winter hours of 10am to 6pm). So start watching for the sign-up sheets for the Spring Skeet and Trap Leagues and sign your John Hancock on the dotted line to join in on all the fun.

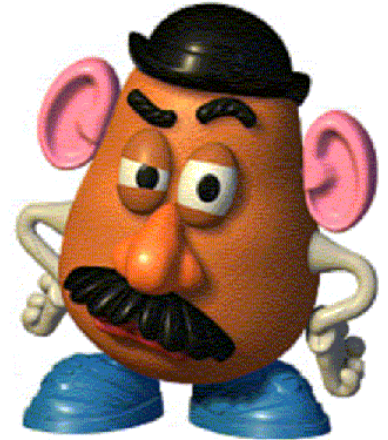

Rifle

February is finished and I am glad to see it go. With March, we begin to see the seasons change and start to think of preparations for the summer shooting season. That said, we note that we are still shooting during the winter.

The Groundhog Shoot held in early February was a success. Twenty one shooters came out to eliminate 2 liter and 0.5 liter pests. The top shooters were Gary Dawson and Corey Salo. Detailed results are given in the results page at www.d-s-c.org.

The next special shoot is the Potato shoot scheduled for Sunday Mar. 17. The targets are potatoes at 50 yards and you shoot them offhand with your rimfire rifle. For more details see this issue of the Plaid and Khaki.

The Rifle Range has open shooting Sundays from 11 a.m.- 3 p.m.

Senior Smallbore hosts shooting Monday afternoons at the Basement Range from 2-4 p.m.

Make plans to attend the Service Rifle Clinic in April. This is a great introduction to service rifle shooting. This is held April 12 & 13. Bring a friend. Look for the flyer under education or coming events on the website.

Finally Sunday, Mar. 3 and 17, you can practice shooting your rimfire rifle on the basement range in the CMP Sporter practice. Bring your 22 rifle and give it a try.

We are always looking for new Range Officers to help out with open shooting. To be an RO you need training. In addition to 3 sessions of on-the-job training, you will need to complete additional courses. The first is the NRA Range Officer training. The DSC offers this training May 18

and Oct. 20. In addition, you need range specific training. For rifle this is offered May 4 and Sep. 15. For more details, check the P&K or the website.

Rifle shooters will note that as of late I have taken up blackpowder shooting. I think that rifle shooters might want to give it a try sometime. To help sway you, each month I will list a reason you might want to give it a try. Here is number 1:

Blackpowder is basically easier to clean up than modern guns. I know that people generally accept the notion that black powder is more work to clean up than modern smokeless powder guns. Now, if you are a casual shooter and shoot your centerfire rifle a couple of times a year you are probably correct. Heck, you probably don't even need to clean it. However, if you are shooting highpower or a signifi-

cant number of centerfire rounds then you need to clean your gun fairly often and this cleaning involves some somewhat nasty bore cleaners to remove the powder residue and after that the copper or lead.. If you want a real mess to clean, then clean the action on an AR-15. Do I need to say "carbon scraper". Now black powder rifles generally shoot linen patched lead round balls. Hence there is no difficult lead or copper to remove. The blackpowder residue is cleaned well with regular hand dish detergent such as DAWN and hot water. You hardly even need to scrub. It is true that you must clean after every shooting session with BP but for the most part its easier that cleaning modern gun with their inherent copper or lead fouling.

Notable Native Americans – “Chief Joseph” (1840-1904) Leader of the Wallowa Band of Nez Perce, a Native American tribe in the Wallowa Valley of Northeastern Oregon.

He was born *Hin-mah-too-yah-lat-kekt* (Nez Perce: “Thunder Rolling Down the Mountain”.) He was known as Young Joseph during his youth because his father, Tuekakas, was baptized with the same Christian name and later became known as “Old Joseph” or “Joseph the Elder”. While many Native American war leaders and chiefs were known for their combative resistance towards the United States’ westward expansion, **Chief Joseph**, was known for his concerted efforts to negotiate and live peacefully with his new neighbors. Although his father, Joseph the Elder, had brokered a peaceful land treaty with the U. S. Government removing the Nez Perce from their ancestral lands in the Wallowa Valley onto a significantly reduced reservation in the Idaho Territory, the Young Joseph reneged on the agreement. To honor the memory of his father, who died in 1871, Chief Joseph resisted staying within the confines of the Idaho reservation that the U. S. Government had mandated. In 1877, the threat of a U. S. Cavalry attack made him relent, and he began leading his people to the reservation. However, when some of the young warriors – angry that their homeland had been stolen from them – raided and killed neighboring white settlers. The U. S. Cavalry began chasing the group down. Reluctantly, Chief Joseph decided to join the warring band of young warriors. Chief Joseph attempted to lead 750-800 Nez Perce men, women and children from the reservation in Idaho to Canada. Approximately 200 of the Nez Perce were actual warri-

ors. The U. S. Army’s pursuit of this group became known as the **Nez Perce War**. The march of the Nez Perce lasted for nearly 1700 miles before being cut off by General Nelson Miles just 40 miles from Canada. Chief Joseph was not known to be a **combat leader**, but many army officers portrayed him as a military genius. His tribe’s 1700-mile march and defense tactics impressed **General William Tecumseh Sherman**, and from then on Chief Joseph was known as the “Red Napoleon”. Tired of bloodshed, Chief Joseph surrendered on October 5, 1877. His emotional surrender speech was etched into the annals of American history. In 1904, he died, and according to his doctor, of a “broken heart”.



Words of Chief

Joseph’s Emotional Formal Surrender:

“Tell General Howard I know his heart. What he told me before, I have in my heart. I am tired of fighting. Our chiefs are killed; Looking Glass is Dead, Too-hul-hul-sote is dead. The old men are all dead. It is the young men who say yes or no. He who led the young men is dead. It is cold, and we have no blankets; the little children are freezing to death. My

people, some of them, have run away to the hills and have no blankets, no food. No one knows where they are - perhaps freezing to death. I want to have time to look for my children, to see how many I can find. Maybe I shall find them among the dead.

Hear me my chiefs! I am tired; my heart is sick and sad. From where the sun now stands, I will fight no more forever.”

Presidents Report: (R. Savo) Life Members and past presidents were recognized. • What groundhog said winter was over? The cold weather has caused problems at our club. The clubhouse septic tank froze over, which we fixed by dumping in salt. The water meter froze over and had to be replaced. The archery building water distribution manifold cracked in 4 places. Dave Oles and I were able to do the repairs. Sporting Clays were without water. These repairs cost us \$1200. • We replaced the compressor on the soda vending machine in the range building. • The electric drawings for the new storage and maintenance building are completed and are awaiting the approval from Shelby Twp. Their stamp of approval will cost us \$1000. I have a complete stamped building drawing. The concrete drawing is stamped and that includes footers, piers, floor, and aprons. • We will be upgrading the lighting in the basement range. The new bulbs are LED tubes that put out over 2000 lumens for the same price as florescent tubes. They use ½ the electricity of the old lamps. • The Candlelight Banquet Center closed their doors and we were able to get a great deal on some kitchen fixtures. We bought a \$4500 commercial dishwasher for only \$235, as well as other kitchen equipment for great prices. • I attended both the Benefit 4 Kids and the SCTP banquets. A great time was had for everybody and these events raised needed dollars for our junior programs. • We had a problem with the range building alarm system due to a faulty sensor. Luckily we were able to avoid charges for false alarms from both the Shelby Twp. Police Department and the alarm company. We replaced the faulty sensor. • If you have any projects, come and see us before seeing the BOD so we can make sure that you have all the information needed before presenting it to the BOD. The Trustees, the Treasurer, the planning commission all need to know what is going on before it is presented to the BOD. If any projects are not approved by the Trustees and the Treasurer, there is no reason to bring it before the BOD.

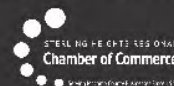
