Saturday wasn't too much better of a day, temperatures in the high 40s to low 50s with a persistent 15- to 20-mph. breeze. A pair of 99s topped the leader board in the 12-gauge event with "Nerz" besting John Klida for the championship; coming in

Rifle

June is here and the rifle leagues have been running for a month. They started slowly at first but have been picking speed as the weather warms up. There are regular leagues for high power/service rifle, small bore silhouette and sporting rifle. We have also added the tactical prone league. This is a league inspired by the NRA F Class competition. Shooting is done from the prone position, but you can use supports as long as the butt of the rifle stays in your shoulder for shooting (i.e. you can use your bipod). We shoot at the MR-52 target that is used in High Power/Service rifle. This target is basically the service rifle 600-yard target reduced in scale to 200-yards. It is a 20-round match in 20 minutes and 10 scores are used to determine the league standings. We generally shoot during the sporting rifle league times (Thursday p.m. and Sunday a.m.). If you are interested, contact wopdycke@mi.rr.com.

This month's black powder note has to do with simplicity. The first league I joined at DSC

was the high power/service rifle league. This league can be intimidating for the new shooter especially considering all the equipment that you need to bring along. You start with your rifle and ammo but then you need a shooting coat, spotting scope and stand, a shooting mat, glove, etc. Indeed, the equipment is so extensive that many high-power competitors bring a cart to carry it all. Three or four trips to the car to get the gear to the line and 15-minutes to set it all up. Contrast that with your typical black powder shoot. You bring your rifle, a range rod for reloading and a shoulder bag for your shooting supplies. No cart is necessary. You run a dry patch down and out the bore and then snap a cap. That's it, you are ready to roll. There are rifle leagues that are almost this simple. Small bore silhouette doesn't take much beyond a rifle and ammo either. Simplicity may or may not be a virtue but I do like the idea that you can just throw a gun and a bag in the car and be ready to compete.

Cowboy

The US Cavalry (1865-1890) – "The Buffalo Sol-

The **Buffalo Soldiers** were African American soldiers who mainly served on the Western frontier following the American Civil War. In 1866, through an act of congress, legislation was adopted to create six all African American army units. **The units were identified as the 9th and 10th Cavalry and the 38th, 39th, 40th and 41st Infantry Regiments.** The four infantry units were reorganized in 1868 as the **24th and 25th Infantry.** Black soldiers enlisted

for five years and received \$13 a month, far more than they could have earned in civilian life. The troops were led by white officers. The 10th cavalry was formed at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, and recruited soldiers from the northern states. **The 10th's commander was Colonel Benjamin Grierson. Colonel Edward Hatch was in command of the 9th Cavalry and he recruited soldiers from the**

southern states. The 10th was headquartered in Greenville, Louisiana. The black regiments could only serve west of the Mississippi River because of the prevailing attitudes following the Civil War. Their main tasks were to help control the Native Americans of the Plains, capture cattle rustlers and thieves and protect settlers, stagecoaches, wagon trains and railroad crews along the Western front. According to the [Buffalo Soldiers National Museum](#), soldiers of the **9th and 10th Cavalry Regiments** were nicknamed **Buffalo Soldiers** by the Cheyenne warriors they fought in 1867. No one is exactly sure why, but some say the nickname was given out of respect for the fierce fighting ability of the 10th Cavalry. Others claim that the Native Americans called the black cavalry troops "Buffalo Soldiers" because of their dark curly hair, which resembled a buffalo's coat. The term **Buffalo Soldiers** became a generic term for all black soldiers. It is still used by U. S. Army units that trace their direct lineage back to the 9th and 10th Cavalry units whose bravery earned them respect and an honored place in United States history. About 20 percent of U. S. Cavalry troops that participated in the Indian Wars were **Buffalo Soldiers**, who participated in at least 177 conflicts.

Presidents Report: (R. Savo) Life Members and past presidents were recognized. • The new septic system for the kitchen and clubhouse has been installed. The work was approved by the Macomb County Health inspector who was thrilled with the quality of the installation. He commented that 80% of other work that he inspects has problems due to installation errors. The only thing left to do is landscaping, filling in the old septic tank and to change the walkways and the landing for handicapped visitors. • The soil at Sporting Clays is soaked and the water level is too high for excavation, so we will have to wait for it to subside. We got a terrific price on what we need to do the job so we have 60-70% of the materials on hand to start it when we can. • Treasurer, Mr. Purdie is watching closely what we spend and he counted the joints we glued putting in the piping. We came up short on primer because Rick accidentally kicked over a primer can with his size-14 feet. But there was money in the budget to buy another can of primer. • We are still getting some quotes for the new building foundation and concrete pouring. We have to hire that out because there is no way we can do it ourselves because of the volume of concrete needed. We have neither the equipment nor the skill to handle a project of that size. • We have 40+ projects that need to be done so we have been prioritizing them as they vary in cost. We will need manpower from our members to get these projects done. If we don't get help, some of the projects simply will not get done. • No July General Membership meeting. Please come out and help with the fireworks parking.

Secretary's Report: (R. Hegelman) The April GM Meeting minutes are on the table by the door and in the book behind the bar, as are the March BOD Meeting minutes.

Treasurers Report: (D. Purdie) The finance results for March 2019 are available. Our YTD income is \$311,167.22. YTD expenses were \$81,964.17. March income was \$93,769.21 and expenses are \$81,964.17 for a YTD net of \$70,297.28. • Our loan balance is \$116,461.21. Looking at March, the star performer is Oxford Camping. Their YTD net is \$78,932.66. The next best venue is Pistol with YTD net being \$27,447.45. • In April Bob and I signed checks for \$70K, extrapolated out for the year is \$820K. That is what it takes to run the place. The financial reports are in a book behind the bar if you want to take a look at them.

1st Vice President's Report: (J. Estes) I am the Chairman of the Grounds and Planning committee. The campground needs a new office building. That is the number one priority for the campground and the next item for them is a storage shed for their equipment. Their equipment is stored outside so we want to get it out of the weather so it does not deteriorate. • We have plans to fill the potholes, but since it rains every day we will be working on them when it dries out a bit. • We have lots of little jobs such as painting in the parking lot, and we need some wood replaced on the skeet houses. Sat.: 4:30 pm sight-in begins. Shooting begins at 5 pm.

COURSE OF FIRE:

The NRA Smallbore Rifle course consists of:

10 chickens at 40 meters, 10 pigs at 60 meters

10 turkeys at 77 meters, 10 rams at 100 meters

Each set of animals is shot in two banks of 5, one shot at each target. There is a time limit of 2 minutes and 30 seconds to fire 5 shots. All shooting for score is from the offhand position. No slings, shooting gloves, or shooting jackets are allowed.

REGISTRATION/FEE:

The Silhouette league fee is \$45. The league fee covers the

league banquet with door prizes. The Banquet is normally held the first Saturday in December. An Associate Membership is \$10. Range Fees are \$6 for Work Hour Members and \$8 for Members and Associate Members. The non-member range fee is \$20. The non-member Escorted Guest fee is \$15. If a Member or an Associate Member wishes to participate in the High Power, Sporting Rifle or Small Bore leagues, no additional league or membership fees will be charged. All Range Fees include a \$1 environmental fee.

LEAGUE SCORING:

A competitor's highest 8 scores will be used to determine league standings. An award certificate will be given to the high scorer in the Master, AAA, AA, and B classes in both Smallbore Rifle and Smallbore Hunting Rifle. Spotters are strongly encouraged, as they can really help shooters improve their performance. Practice scores may be shot, but league members shooting for record have priority. All record scorecards must be turned in to the R.O. upon completion of the match.
