Rifle

The Dog Days of Summer are upon us. The Summer leagues are still in full swing but the shadows are beginning to creep into the evening leagues reminding us that we need to get our scores in before the light goes.

Service rifle has been doing pretty well as they average 6-10 shooters for each league session.

Smallbore silhouette gets about the same or maybe a little less. I haven't heard much from sporting rifle and I have been getting only a few scores for the new Tactical Prone League. There is still plenty of time to come out and try these events. Come on out and have some fun.

While the number of shooters is down for the Tactical Prone League, the scores are certainly up. After 5 matches, several shooters

have only dropped 3 or 4 points and have X-counts of 10 to 15. This is a fun league and you don't need to use a coat or sling up. A simple forearm rest will work fine. This league is practically designed around bolt action rifles with high quality optics attached. Even so, a match grade AR-15 will do pretty well. It is good practice even if you are using iron sights. In that case, keeping all your shots in the black might be the challenge. For more information contact the author at wopdycke@mi.rr.com.

Your black powder note this month concerns rifle sights. Black Power is mostly an iron sight affair. Most rifle venues are now ruled by optics. Service Rifle was the last holdout, but they folded 3 years ago. Now, if you want

to be competitive in service rifle, you need a rugged 4x rifle scope. At the minimum, these cost about \$400 but can be as much as \$2000. Add on a typical AR-15 National match setup and we are talking about an investment of \$1300 to \$2900 to shoot High Power! That's a lot for a new shooter to invest before they know whether they like it or not. In contrast, an entry level BP gun might be a Traditions Hawken for \$400 or so. Out of the box this gun is good for woods walk competition, hunting, etc. It has simple iron sights. There is no knobs to fiddle with and get out of adjustment. Parallax, Smear-allax, line up your iron sights and shoot the darn steel plate!

committee and identify that individual or individuals that have ideas to improve the club or want to be in on the discussion at any level and are willing to promote those ideas as members of either the DSC Board or as a Trustee.

- Third, contact your committee's election rep and NOMINATE that individual



for an open position on this year's election ballot. That includes nominating yourself for a position.

- Finally, the election committee will do the rest by checking that member's eligibility, confirming their interest to have their name placed on the ballot and run-

ning the election.

Easy right!?!

The election committee will be putting together the initial slate of nominees for the open positions before the September general membership meeting. Members nominated from the floor at the September general membership meeting will also be added to the list. Any DSC voting member who has been a member for at least two years by Sep. 4, 2019 and whose membership is in good standing, is eligible to run for one of the open director or trustee positions. A candidate may be nominated for more than one position, however, he or she may only accept and appear on the ballot for one office in any one election.

Nominee letters will go out Sep. 5, 2019 and nominees will have until close of business Sep. 13, 2019 to notify the office in writing of their acceptance. Nominees that fail to notify the office of their intention within the specified time

frame will be presumed to have refused the nomination and their name will be removed from the list of eligible candidates. The letter includes a resume form and a request for a photograph that will be used for the P&K nominee article .

During the November general membership meeting, each candidate is allowed three minutes to present their ideas, goals and/or qualifications.

If anyone has any election related questions or would like to be nominated or nominate another member for an open position, please send me an email or get in touch with the DSC office at or before the September general membership Meeting.

The US Cavalry (1865-1890)
Notable Leaders, Indian Wars

“General Nelson A. Miles”

(Aug. 8, 1839 – May 15, 1925)

Nelson Appleton Miles was an American military general who served in the American Civil War, the American Indian Wars, and the Spanish American War. Miles volunteered as a private in 1861, and fought at Antietam, Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville, the Wilderness, and Spotsylvania Court House. Wounded four times, he



received the Medal of Honor for his actions at Chancellorsville (where he was wounded in the neck and abdomen). He became a lieutenant in the 22nd Regiment Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry and was commissioned a lieutenant colonel of the 61st New York Volunteer Infantry Regiment on May 31, 1862. He was promoted to colonel after the Battle of Antietam. After the war, he was appointed to colonel in the regular army. In 1869, he became commander of the 5th U.S. Infantry Regiment. Miles played a leading role in

nearly all the U. S. Army's campaigns against the American Indian tribes of the Great Plains. In 1874-1875, he was a field commander in the force that defeated the Kiowa, Comanche, and the Southern Cheyenne in the Red River War. Between 1876-1877, he participated in the campaign that scoured the Northern Plains after Lt. Col. George Armstrong Custer's defeat at the Battle of the Little Big Horn and forced the Lakota and their allies onto reservations. In the winter of 1877, he drove his troops on a forced march across eastern Montana to intercept the Nez Perce band led by Chief Joseph at the conclusion of the Nez Perce War. In 1885, now a brigadier general, he was appointed the head of the Department of the Missouri. In 1886, he captured Geronimo. Promoted again in 1890, he commanded the Division of the Missouri and oversaw the troop mobilization that led to the Wounded Knee Massacre, a disaster that destroyed Miles's hopes for a presidential nomination. Miles died in 1925 at the age of 85 from a heart attack while attending a circus in Washington D.C. with his grandchildren.

August is a busy month for Black Powder. We host two big events this month.

The first is the 32nd Annual Memorial Shoot. This shoot will be held Sunday, Aug. 11. Festivities begin at 9 a.m. with the Opening Ceremony. Skeet and Trap

The Dog Days of Summer 2019 are upon us! And what, pray tell, are the Dog Days of Summer? Well, to be precise, they are historically the days following the heliacal rising of the star system Sirius, which Greek and Roman astrology connected with heat, drought, sudden thunderstorms, lethargy, fever, mad dogs and bad luck! Nowadays, they are more related to those hottest and most humid days of summer... typically August.

Hot, humid days, to be truthful, started earlier than the month of August for us this year. We had our share of those days in July. Those of us shooting clay sports (or anyone recreating in the out-of-doors) can tell you that in no uncertain terms! But, there are plenty of hot, humid days to come in the coming month, so we must persevere and try to keep the bad luck and those mad dogs at bay! Seriously (pun intended... check the first paragraph)!

We've got two **registered skeet shoots** coming up in August. The first one is the Hanaford Open, to be held Friday to Sunday, Aug. 2-4. Skeet will be closed to the public (and non-participating members) during the

shoot, but trap will be open. This is traditionally one of DSC's largest skeet shoots of the year. It's also DSC's "Buckle Shoot", for added incentive to participate. This year the Michigan Skeet Association instituted a state-wide "Buckle Race" that is open to all MSA 4-gun registered skeet participants who compete in at least 5 of 12 "Buckle Race Shoots" throughout the summer. The last shoot is the Michigan State Shoot in mid-August and that shoot is mandatory. Otherwise, shooters only need to participate in 5 shoots to be in the running for the State Buckle! If you shoot more than five (4-gun) events, your top five shoots are used for scoring purposes. There are four divisions in the Buckle Race (including an SCTP division) depending on your 4-gun (HOA) shooting average, so it's not something for just the best shooters, as it's formulated to include potential for all. Buckles will be presented to first and second place in each of the four divisions. Not only are Buckles awarded, but some cash prizes will be awarded as well. Juniors are eligible for a modest scholarship.

The second registered skeet event at DSC this August is the **Doubles**

Mini Shoot, to be held Thursday, Aug. 29. A number of clubs throughout the State have been holding these Mini Shoots over the past few years. They are a great way to enter into the world of registered skeet shoots, as they are only one gun – 100 targets. This is a manageable chunk of target shooting for any of you thinking of getting into the competitive world of registered skeet.

Junior Shotgun is also in full swing this August, with practice rotating between Skeet and Sporting Clays on alternating Tuesday's and Wednesday's at 4 p.m.. Practice will move back to Sunday's (at noon) in September once school resumes. This is a great program to get the future shooters of tomorrow up-to-speed on the clay target sports!

Finally, the **Fall Skeet and Trap Fun Leagues** will begin Thursday, Aug. 29, with registration Aug. 1 thru Sep. 5. It seems like the Spring League just ended, but that's just your imagination... it ended way back in early June! So be thinking about getting the shotgun out and getting ready for the Fall Leagues to begin!
